### Introduction

- The State Chapters of the NSN are the cells that make up the society. This brief presentation is a snapshot of activities, accomplishments and initiatives that have characterized NSN's operations between September 2022 and September 2023.
- The State chapters of the NSN have continued to change the face of nutrition in our country via community-based interventions, educational outreaches, advocacy, research, and capacity building for members, among other activities.
- Reports submitted by 12 chapters in the South, 6 in the North. This is a SUMMARY of all reports. Full reports to be submitted to the NSN National Secretariat.
- Appreciation to all chapters for their work

#### Activities

- The 2023 World Breastfeeding Week was observed in several states: Abia, Anambra, Cross-River, Osun, Ekiti, Lagos, Osun, Ebonyi, Edo, and Rivers in the first week of August
- Diverse Activities across the States to raise awareness , teach breastfeeding skills and advocate for breastfeeding





- Participation in the State Committee on Food and Nutrition Meetings by chapters of Bayelsa and Anambra
- World Food Safety Day; e.g. in celebration of World Food Safety Day, the **Ekiti** State Chapter of NSN had nutrition education outreaches to the two secondary schools





- In collaboration with NAFDAC, Lagos chapter had nutrition education programs on Food Fraud.
- Lagos also celebrated the World Hypertension Day through a public enlightenment programme

- Osun State Chapter commemorated the World Food Day, highlighted the need of school gardens in ensuring proper nutrition through a school gardening workshop and distribution of fruit and vegetable seedlings
- Cross River also celebrated World Food Day: high-level engagement meeting with related Statehouse committee and legislative council members
- Close-out meeting on the commercialization of biofortified crops organised by Cross River State in collaboration with GAIN/Harvestplus
- Oyo State celebrated World Milk Day through Seminar Presentation
- Edo chapter participated in the flag off of the Edo State First Round of the MNCH and World Breastfeeding Week celebration
- Anambra chapter: Radio programmes on diabetes, Health talks on Nutrition to parishioners in Awka, Ekwulobia, Nnewi and Awka

#### **Advocacy visits and State Meetings**

- Anambra participated in State Committee on Nutrition meeting hosted in Awka
- Visit to Wife of the governor (Oyo)
- Visit to the NYSC State Coordinator and Directors of the scheme in Oyo State
- Courtesy/advocacy visit to the Vice Chancellor MOUAU (Abia)
- Advocacy visits (Bayelsa) to
  - the Special Adviser to the Governor on Health
  - Honorable Commissioner for Health
  - Executive Secretary Bayelsa State Primary Health Care Board
- Rivers chapter Partnered with the Rivers State Primary Health Care Management Board for WBW

- Grant-winning research proposal writing workshops: These workshops were independently organized by Oyo and Osun to equip their members on grant winning proposal writing skills.
- Nutrition Talk among Retired Executive Secretaries Ekiti State
- One-day capacity-building symposium for the nutrition workforce in Ondo state on current infant and young child nutrition practices
- Ebonyi chapter participated fully in The first Ebonyi Hidden Hunger Conference was organized by the Ebonyi State Committee on Food and Nutrition in partnership with Alex Ekwueme Federal University Ndufu-Alike



### Membership growth

- Membership increased in several chapters over the past year. For example:
- Ekiti membership rose from 62 to 89
- In Cross-River, membership increased from 61 to 71
- In Osun state from 42 to 84 members.
- 36 new members were added in Lagos state
- In Oyo State, a total of 61 new members were added over the year.
- For Rivers, 25 new members were added over the year

### CHALLENGES

- Lack of funds in most states e.g Abia, Edo, Ekiti but coping strategies are employed e.g donations, partnerships in cash and kind from organizations in Lagos.
- Low membership strength in Anambra
- Poor turnout of members for general meetings in all states
- Members are scattered all over the State in both Oyo, Lagos and Edo, this makes it difficult for in-person state chapter meetings.
- Members default in the annual dues e.g Cross-River, Osun, Lagos, Rivers, and Edo states
- Poor communication from NSN National

### **OPPORTUNITIES**

- Virtual meetings for increased membership participation in Oyo state
- Zonal membership drive in Lagos state
- Nutrition outreach to different communities, trainings and enlightenment programs on radio and Television will create more awareness on nutrition in Ekiti State.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Annual zonal meetings and training for chapter leaders were recommended, so that the small chapters can learn from what older chapters are doing.
- The national should from time to time organize nutrition programmes/workshops involving training of upcoming nutritionists from the State alongside with their counterparts from other State chapters.
- NSN national should serve as a channel for grant opportunities for nutrition research in the chapter whenever the need arises.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Council and national secretariat should communicate with state chapters and state nutrition officials more frequently in order to inspire ideas and strengthen engagement amongst all members.
- The State Chapter executives should be included in workshops/seminars and training organized by the national body of NSN.
- The National NSN can support the State Chapters by collecting the annual dues and remitting it to the State Chapter also by making it a requirement that all members of the National must show evidence of being active in their respective State Chapters to retain their membership.

### Activities

- >World Breastfeeding Week 2023 by several states
- The NSN, Adamawa State Chapter, held 2 big events during World Breastfeeding Week to advocate for and encourage breastfeeding support in the workplace.
- Commemoration of World Breastfeeding Week August 2023 in collaboration with ANRiN Project Kaduna State, Kaduna State Ministry of Health, and North-west Zonal Chapter of Baby Friendly Initiative
- Awareness campaign by the NSN Taraba state to PHCs, Taraba state teaching hospital, Jalingo



#### Activities

- A number of initiatives were run at the FMC, Specialist Hospital, Campaign, to raise knowledge and sensibility in Primary Healthcare Facilities in Taraba state
- Courtesy visit to the NAFDAC office in Kano to engage discussions on some issues like methylene oxide in noodles, aspartame caution by WHO, and other food safety issues
- A refresher workshop for 100 healthcare professionals was conducted by NSN Kano on the most recent issues in child development and health.

#### Kaduna Chapter: Series of activities were carried both at the FMC, Specialist Hospital, Campaign and awareness/ sensitization at College of Science and Technology, Campos Kaduna.

### CHALLENGES

- Lack of commitment and ownership from the members in some states
- Financial constraints, and communication gaps between the national and state levels
- Funding has been the major challenge during the period under review, however, the chapter is working toward improving the strategy use in mobilizing resources for the Kaduna state chapter.
- Lack of well defined constitutional provisions of how the state will seek support from the national or distribution of funds to the state
