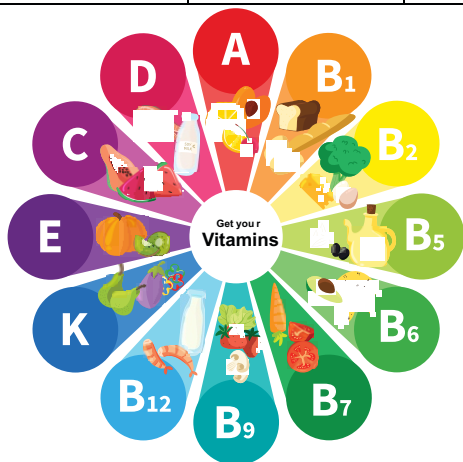

## ABOUT LAGOS STATE

Lagos state, southwestern Nigeria, on the coast of the Bight of Benin. It is bounded by the state of Ogun to the north and east, by the Bight of Benin to the south, and by the Republic of Benin to the west. From 1914 to 1954 the area included in the state was administered by the British as part of the colony of Nigeria. The provisions of the 1954 constitution led to the creation of the Federal Territory of Lagos (3,000+ square kilometers) area of Lagos Island, including the city of Lagos) and to the transfer of the city's hinterland to the administrative region of Western Nigeria state, Nigeria

Lagos is one of the most populous urban centers in Africa. It serves as the country's commercial, financial, and industrial hub, playing a central role in Nigeria's economy and regional trade in West Africa. Lagos is located in southwestern Nigeria along the Atlantic Ocean. The state is characterized by coastal plains, lagoons, and islands, including Lagos Island, Victoria Island, and Ikoyi. It has an estimated population of over 20 million people, making it one of the fastest-growing megacities in the world. The city is highly cosmopolitan, attracting migrants from different parts of Nigeria and other African countries. Lagos is the economic powerhouse of Nigeria, contributing a large share of the country's GDP. The city is known for its vibrant

culture, entertainment, and nightlife. It is the center of Nigeria's music industry (Afrobeats), fashion, film (Nollywood), and arts. The city hosts several cultural festivals, beaches, markets, and tourist attractions. Infrastructurally, Lagos harbour Murtala Muhammed International Airport, Lagos seaports (Apapa and Tin Can), Eko Atlantic City development, Lagos Rail Mass Transit and Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) systems.

Times New Roman and font size 12 should be used. The page margins should be set at Normal (Top = 2.35cm, Bottom = 2.54cm, Left = 2.54cm and Right = 2.54cm).
